Program Description

Beyond Akeela is an overnight teen program that supports and develops the socialemotional, organizational, and independent living skills of teens preparing to transition to college. Set on a college campus, Beyond Akeela teens gain experience with dorm living, navigating a college campus, and managing their daily schedule with coaching and mentorship from an experienced group of young professionals.

Daily activities include community service opportunities, traditional camp activities, dedicated exercise time, teen talks, and exciting day trips. All the while they'll be cooking for each other, doing their own laundry, managing budgets, developing meaningful peer connections, and having conversations about teen appropriate topics to reflect on their readiness for college. Job Description

The Beyond Akeela Nurse plays is the leader of the healthcare team at Beyond Akeela. They are responsible for medication administration, parent communication surrounding camper health, triaging a variety of health situations, and are aware of the overall health and well-being of the camp community. They will make recommendations to the Directors on adjustments to make mid-season as needed to improve the global health of the camp community. The nurse is responsible for all medication and treatment logging and ensuring the health care practices are on par or exceed the standards set by the ACA and NH DHHS.

The nurse works under the standing orders provided from a local physician and makes decisions on treatment plans for each camper and staff member. They are also responsible for checking in on staff members health, and helping the Directors ensure that staff are physically and mentally prepared to work.

- Remains calm and is confident making sound decisions in high stress emergency situations.
- Has BLS certification and is confident assessing a variety of medical situations and making appropriate health care decisions for teens and adults.

- Values the importance of building relationship with campers and is excited about spending time with teens outside of the health center.
- Possesses excellent written and verbal communication skills.

- Has the ability to live and work in a stimulating and high stress work environment with irregular hours including early mornings and evenings.
